

shipping, sales, customer service – and an easel with a big pad of paper. We'll order food and drinks and then whichever poor sap has been designated as scribe will pull out a marker and the list of new boat concepts. We'll roll through everything on the list, model by model, and shout out potential names for each design, and the scribe will jot every suggestion down, one page for each boat. Admittedly, the majority of what is suggested is utterly unusable. But the remaining names are written down on a new page, and we have an official vote – and that's how we decide the names for next year's boats. After that we finish our drinks, pack up, and leave the waiter wondering what the heck just happened.

It sounds kind of silly, but it's actually a lot of fun. The great thing is that it makes those of us who aren't doing the high-profile stuff like designing the boats or paddling for a living feel proud – because we contributed something significant to something important – the naming of the boats.

Sure, we've been around a long time and changed paddling in a lot of ways, and sure, we've changed too since Joe and the boys began building boats in a dirt floor shed in Harriman, Tennessee. Sure, we have amazing people like Snowy Robertson, Tony Lee, Marc Lule, and Steve Scarborough designing boats for us, and sure, we support an incredible team of professional paddlers of whom we're terribly proud. But besides all that, at the very core, we're just a bunch of people who love paddling, who want to contribute something significant to something important. Or more simply, besides all that, at the very core, we're Dagger. If you'll notice, that's the one name that goes on all of our boats. And we don't have to vote about that.
